

 - 5%-Other



Full Service Partnerships Service Outcomes 2008-2013


% Frequency of Events



Outreach and Training



Hope House Total Participants CY 2013



Innovation

- **Purpose** - *pilot new organizational processes* to improve services to clients, families, and community
- **Current Initiative** - Improved Behavioral Health and Health Services integration
 - **Past Strategies**
 - 12/13 - Emergency Room Response and Primary Care Integration
 - Almond Access Center - Crisis Worker & Peer Support (250 served)
 - Health Net, Contracted Pharmacist and Primary Care – (50 served)
 - **Current Strategy**
 - Improve Information Exchange and Coordination of Care
 - Common Clients of BHS, Camarena Health Centers, Madera Community Hospital and Health Plans

State Wide Funds

- **Statewide PEI Services** (CalMHSA Joint Powers Authority)
 - **2010** - Madera County joined several other counties to locally administer the State-wide PEI funds/services
 - **Statewide PEI Services Included**
 - **Suicide Prevention** Hotline run by Kingsview Corp.
 - **Stigma and Discrimination** Campaign - Madera received \$15,000 to provide county-wide discussions re: mental health.

PEI Statewide Funds

- **5 Counties Support Central Valley Suicide Prevention Hotline**
 - Kings View Operates Hotline
 - **2013 - 120 calls Madera County**
 - 70% crisis calls that otherwise would have accessed Emergency Department or Law Enforcement
 - 30% requests for information, someone to talk to, etc.
 - **2005 - 2013 - 22 Average Annual Suicide Rate**
 - 2013's Most Frequent Suicide Demographics
 - 49 - Average Age
 - Madera - Most Frequent City
 - Male - Most Frequent Gender
 - Caucasian - Most Frequent Race/Ethnicity

Stigma and Discrimination Grant

- **#1 Barrier to Accessing Mental Health Care**
- **Impact** - loss of employment, housing and educational resources for people with mental illness
- **Recognized earlier than Age 10 yrs.**
- **Madera Campaign**
 - Partners - Public Health, Probation, Social Services, County Office of Education
 - Over 500 people from different organizations briefed as of 2/27/2014 regarding impact of stigma on mental health service access and the campaign
 - Three large community dialogues March 20 and 25th and April 2014





Funding Percentages




Mental Health Services Priorities - Last Year
